SKIP THE EXTRA TREATS!

Chocolate, alcohol, fatty foods, and uncooked dough can all pose a risk if ingested. Remember to keep the holiday treats far out of your pet's reach!

DECK THE HALLS, WITH SAFETY IN MIND

Be careful with ribbon and tinsel as kitties love to eat it, which can cause a surgical emergency! Also be sure that electrical cords and candles are far out of your pet's reach!

MINIMIZE THAT HOLIDAY STRESS!

House guests and holiday parties can be stressful. Make sure your pet has a quiet place of their own to get away if they don't want to be the life of the party. Also make sure guests are keeping the extra treats to a minimum!

Holiday Plants

Lilies are toxic to cats! They can cause severe acute kidney failure with just one lick!



Mistletoe is toxic and can cause vomiting, diarrhea, and less commonly cardiovascular effects such as low blood pressure



Poinsettias have a reputation for being toxic, however they generally only cause mild gastrointestinal upset
